So many small film festivals don't reach their 20th edition. The fact that we have is testament to you for buying tickets and supporting IFF. Thank you so much. Over the years, we have screened around 500 feature films plus 200 Scottish shorts. It's always exciting to see these filmmakers go on to make their feature film debut which we can then show in the festival. This year we have Charlotte Wells' Cannes award-winning *Aftersun* playing on Sat 05 Nov, having previously screened her shorts.

I was in the projection booth for the first film of the festival on Thu 06 Nov 2003. It was a Highlands-set comedy, *One Last Chance*, and it screened in what was known as 'Eden Court Main Auditorium' to a sold-out audience. The first IFF film that I programmed was *The Last King of Scotland* in 2006, the following year's festival opened the new cinemas with the Coen Brothers' *No Country for Old Men*. Our beautiful 'new' cinemas are soon to be 15 years old.

The Audience Award will be making a welcome return this year. There will be no more slips of paper to rip, just a button to push as you exit the film. We have films from Scotland and around the world, the return of wonderful musician Stephen Horne (accompanying the 1919 silent film *Behind the Door*), as well as some favourites from previous festivals screening during weekday afternoons.

I'm looking forward to seeing you at the festival, please do say hello and let me know what you've been watching. It will be fantastic to hear your thoughts on the films; this could be one of the best years we've had.

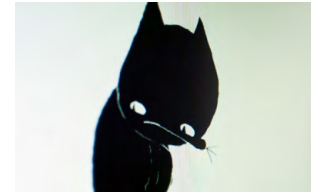

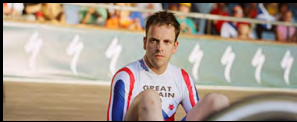
